

And at the same time, it breathes life into the characteristics we all desire in our lives such as kindness, faithfulness and self control.

If you truly want to challenge yourself and family to something that will get you closer to the heart of God, practice Christian gratitude daily for 30 days. Talk about it everyday-morning, noon and night. Find bible verses that include the words: gratitude, appreciation, thanks, thankful, thankfulness, grateful, recognition, obligation, tribute, indebtedness, praise, honor, or grace.

Call to order @6:30:pm by Ron Dayton Pastor Jen Wilson opening prayer

6:40p - Karl Nordvall on acoustic improvements to heritage hall. Showed a 4x4 piece, install some ceiling panels as test pieces. Attaches directly to studs. Hope is to have phase 1 done by Christmas.

6:48p - Card Ministry. Various individuals. 6:50p - Pastor Jen Wilson message - be aware of your "leadership soul" during this season of meetings.

History Speaks By Judy Vasby **Cemetery Stroll—Remembrance of the Saints**

One of the unique things about Willerup UMC is that is has its own cemetery. It has been there since the church was built in the 1850's, part of the legacy given to us by the founding church fathers. Since All Saint's Day is November 1st, I got to thinking about the Willerup Saints who are buried next to our church.

A lot can be learned about history and culture from taking a stroll and reading the grave stones. There was an era when it was popular to write epitaphs for the deceased. Can you find any epitaphs engraved on headstones in Willerup's cemetery? Are there indications of a flu epidemic—lots of deaths within a period of a month or two? Can you identify familiar church family names?

Look for the oldest marker. It is in the section immediately to the west of the sanctuary, about in the middle.

In that same area, can you find a few graves with cement "curbs" around them? It was the custom in the 1800s to elevate the graves by marking out a rectangular piece of ground raised in the air a foot or more and contained by cement or wooden braces. These raised graves were spaced about four feet apart and got to be a nuisance to mow, being that one had to lift a lawn mower up to the flat top to cut the grass on each plot. So one year, when a house was being built on John Johnson's road (behind the parsonage), Lester Jarlsberg offered to haul away the left over dirt. He used the grain trucks with dumps on them that he had for his grain business downtown and moved the dirt to the cemetery. However, to get it spread around between those raised graves, he had to use wheelbarrows. It turned out to be a lot of work, but today, we can zip riding mowers up and down and around the grave stones, on level ground, saving lots of time.

Although many of the founding members of Willerup Church are buried in Stoughton, where they went to start a second Norwegian Methodist church, a number of headstones carry the names of members who joined in the late 1800s: the Lillesands, Jens England (the father of Don Prescott's mother), the Netlands (grandparents of Lester Jarlsberg).

Some missionaries are buried here, too: Elva Vasby Dekker (aunt to Kent Vasby) and Rev. Mooney, who was married to Don Prescott's sister, Winifred. He started a big church (not Methodist) in an unused super market building in Sheboygan.

If you look hard, you will find 13 pastors buried on our grounds. Among them are Rev. Sannaker, Rev. P.M. Peterson, Rev. Jens Yndestad, Rev. Josephson, Rev. Rohrstaf, Rev. Edwards, Rev. Danielsen (who guided the church renovation in 1901) and Rev. Gilbert Gilberts (grandpa to Glenn Gilberts and father-in-law to Lester Jarlsberg). Ole Jacobson was a local preacher. Rev. Wilbur Egeland and Rev. Harold Peterson did not serve Willerup Church, but were related to Willerup families and chose to be buried in our cemetery.


