
HISTORY SPEAKS for June 2024

Long May She Live- Part 3

...Our story left off at the point when Rev. Christian B. Willerup had arrived in Cambridge in November of 1850, sent by the Board of Missions of the Methodist Episcopal Church, to minister to the Norwegian immigrants in the area. He began preaching to the settlers in the small schoolhouse and soon had 67 people interested in Methodism.

A short while later a revival broke out which helped in the “building up” of a church. Besides holding church services, Rev. Willerup also had prayer and class “meets,” which were new to the people, in which they learned more about Methodism.

The Norwegian people were so “hungry” for the gospel in their own language and more knowledge of Methodism that they gathered everywhere Willerup spoke. One day he said to the people, “We think of building a church soon; a stone structure 44 by 64 feet, such as we ought to have here; besides the \$700 we have subscribed in money and labor, we have two acres of land on which to build, where we may have the graveyard.” [Historian’s note: this was before the body of believers was officially a church. Rev. Willerup had a great vision for what God wanted to accomplish at Cambridge.]

In April of 1851, a church was organized into a congregation and on May 3 of the same year, the church was incorporated in Madison, Wisconsin, with 52 members. It was declared “the first Scandinavian Methodist Church in the World” and fourth, and by all odds, the largest Norwegian Church of any denomination in America. In his report to the Methodist Board of Missions, which had sent Willerup to Cambridge, Isaac Leihy, Presiding Elder [like today’s District Superintendent], spoke of “Willerup’s intense devotion to the Cambridge building program” and added that “Cambridge is the largest and most prosperous society of the Norwegian Mission.” (quoted from *The Salt of the Earth* by Arlow Andersen, p.42)

Yet, the financial situation of the Cambridge Methodist Episcopal Church wasn’t in the best of shape. The building would cost \$4000, but the members were able to raise only \$400 in cash and \$300 in labor. To cut the cost down some more, the farmers brought in stones from their own fields for the walls. [Historian’s note: other accounts indicate that much of the wall material came from the limestone quarry near Rockdale.] Some of the members even went so far as to mortgage their farms to help pay the great expense. Rev. Willerup also put as much as possible toward the church as he could. Out of his quarterly allowance, which was \$125: \$90 went to the workmen so that they wouldn’t quit working; \$30 went to Watertown



on the payment of his buggy; and [only] \$5 went for housekeeping. Also, he mortgaged his horse and buggy which were very essential for his work. Once when he was coming back from his circuit [several other preaching points], he was confronted by a sheriff who threatened to take his horse and buggy away, because of the heavy mortgages on them. Willerup remarked calmly to the sheriff, “Although they may sell me out, they cannot sell the House of God.” [from *Salt of the Earth*, p43.]
